Buenos Aires Argentine Steakhouse is situated on the Brighton Road in South Croydon , having opened in 2009 it is part of the chain owned by Linda and Christian Barrionuevo . If you have not visited it yet we strongly recommend that you do!

Decorated with an Argentinean theme the restaurant offers a cosy and warm setting with intimate tables, soft lighting and a friendly atmosphere. On our recent visit we were welcomed by the Matre Di Diego who originally from Argentina speaks very good English and makes you feel at home as soon as you walk through the door.

Once shown to our table we were able to study the comprehensive menu whilst enjoying complimentary tapas dishes of Spanish Olives, Slices of Chiabatta Bread with Garlic and Mozzarella Cheese and a Spicy Chilli & Garlic Dip

There are a wide range of starters including Tapas dishes and several Argentine specialities such as Empandas a traditional pastie, Chorizo Criollo – Argentine chargrilled beef and pork sausage or Morcilla – Argentine Black Pudding Sausage.

We chose the spicy Chorizo Sausage and grilled red pepper topped with garlic and parsley to start with.

As expected from an Argentine restaurant the main courses offer a wide choice of steaks prepared on an Argentine grill (Sirloin, Rump, Fillet and Ribeye).

Buenos Aires only serves quality Argentine Prime Beef. Should you wish for something other than steak there are also a variety of chicken and lamb dishes .

We opted for the Rump steak topped with gratinated vegetables and the Sirloin served with 2 fried eggs, both dishes were accompanied by a light green salad and French fries. The steaks, cooked to perfection by the experienced chef George simply melted in the mouth .

There is an extensive wine list of both red and white wines to accompany your meal including some fine Melbec & Mondoza along with several Argentine beers - all reasonable priced.

If you have room you can choose from a selection of deserts including bread pudding, homemade cream caramel and pancakes all accompanied with the famous Argentine Toffee sauce.

We finished our meal with a cup of freshly made coffee and and a glass of Mendoza (Malamado red liqueur wine – Argentine Port)

Our evening at Buenos Aries was thoroughly enjoyable and relaxing, the food was delicious and the staff friendly and attentive and we will definitely be going again.
